Diarmuid MacMahon died on the 8th of August 2018. He was the principal of St Marks SNS, Springfield, Tallaght from 1973 to 1997. He was the first principal of St Marks SNS. Springfield was just a new area at the time. He was the definitive professional. He immersed himself in St Marks. He was a dedicated educator. He embraced new challenges and greeted the changing curriculum as the consummate professional. Decisions were made as a whole staff. Votes were taken and issues were discussed. Diarmuid was a mentor and a friend. As a friend he was warm and personable. He was there if you needed to talk to him. He always enjoyed the social nights out. One always felt confident to be able to express an opinion.
