WHAT THEMES ARE EMERGING FROM THE GATHERING?

COMMUNITY: Sense of belonging. Aging population of priests and laity. Multicultural presence is a gift. Youth Apathy - have we lost them?

FAITH: Desire to deepen personal Faith. Learn how to pass on the Faith to others.

WOMEN: Exclusion of Women from key activities. Decision making in the Church. IMPORTANCE of Laity involvement and empowerment in parish life.

Abuse scandals. Clericalism on the part of priests and some laity. Secularisation. Negative attitude of Media to the Church and Christian values. Vatican 2 and Social Issues.

WHAT MIGHT THE HOLY SPIRIT BE INDICATING IN THIS?

We are all members of The People of God. We need to find ways of REACHING OUT and LISTENING to all. We shall act in such a way that all feel Welcome.
